# WHAT ABOUT US?

ll across our world today, we witness much strife, violence and conflict. There is also uncertainty; some created by Brexit, and other by global

issues that seem far away and yet impact us. Jesus was born into such a world in his own time. His own life was threatened when he was a child and his parents moved quickly to protect him. Rather than give in to despair, Jesus brought words of good news, quickly followed by action, that demonstrated the uniqueness of each person especially highlighting the dignity of the poor. In his life, he exemplified, love, forgiveness, non-judgement and hope. These Christian values are timeless and needed more than ever today. As Jesus left

To anyone who struggles and who feels alone look for help. Often to look for help is a sign of strength and not of weakness. I finish with words in a poem called, **Yes, We can Talk**, by Mark Nepo:

Having loved enough and lost enough, I am no longer searching, Just opening. No longer trying to make sense of pain But trying to be a soft and sturdy home In which real things can land

I wish you and all your loved ones peace and happiness this Christmas.

#### FAMILY MASS GROUP



There is a large number of young families in our parish and we always welcome those who want to join us. We meet to arrange the liturgy and regularly look for children to read (lots of prayers – from short ones to longer ones!), carry the gifts to the altar and take part in our special liturgies throughout the year. Our choir has over 100 members now, aged 4 to 17. Over the past few years, we have taken part in choral festivals in Kilkenny, Limerick and Cork, coming 2nd and 3rd in the under 25's category in the International Cork Choral Competition in 2016 and 2017 respectively. Other events have included carol singing for the Irish Guide Dogs, the 60th Anniversary Concert for our church, and the Television Mass on RTÉ on Christmas Day in 2010. # Members of the Baptism Team

**BAPTISM TEAM** 

n our Parish we are fortunate to have a Baptism Team, who work alongside the priest, to prepare the family and their child(ren) for the Sacrament of Baptism. Baptisms are held, normally, on the 2nd and 4th Saturday of the month.

It is a community focused sacrament in which up to four families can be involved and is celebrated around the baptismal font at the entrance to the Church.

Before the Baptism takes place a member of the Baptism Team will call out to you, at home, to meet with you. We look forward to celebrating your child's Baptism.

Every year we invite back those who were baptised in the previous year to one of the Family Masses in January. With over 100 Baptisms every year now – it can be a big celebration! The next Baptism Mass is on **21 January at 11.15am**.

We hope that it will have relevance to all of us, specially as our journey towards the World Meeting.

In the past year, as usual, we have been guided by the seasons, liturgical and temporal, for many of the installations. We began after Christmas with the theme of Hope, pinning up positive quotations among images of new flowering shoots, and we asked

It is not easy to say good bye, but it must be said. I thank everyone who has made my stay in Ireland worthwhile. I thank especially all the parishioners of the three parishes for allowing me to journey with them, teaching me few Irish words. Go raibh maith agat.
