

Thank God for Zoom and the webcam! This week, as during the entire pandemic the livestreaming of liturgies and prayer from the church has been a lifesaver. Beginning on last Thursday with the brilliant Jessie Rogers giving the Lenten talk from her home and going out live by Zoom and then available on the website, followed on Friday with the beautiful evening of reflection and prayer led by the funeral ministry group. We were able to login and follow Fr Brian celebrating a warm, gentle and uplifting funeral for a lady who was 101 on Saturday.

Sunday morning Mass streamed almost without interruption and allowed me to address the distress experienced by the families and friends of those effected by a recent communication from the Vatican.

Monday morning was the regular Mass to pray with and for the sick. Then for me the absolute highlight of the week, 57 families with their candidate for Confirmation came to a Zoom meeting and we listened to their prayers and music and watched their baptismal candles being passed from one generation to the next.



PALM SUNDAY - 10am MASS

Jesus enters the City of Jerusalem on a donkey. A big crowd welcomes Him. They shout 'Hosanna', wave palm branches and lay them, along with their cloaks, on the ground for Him. At 10am Mass Fr Joe will bless palms as we together begin our journey into Holy Week and read The Passion from St Mark's Gospel. Blessed palms may be collected from the church after Mass.

HOLY THURSDAY - 7.30pm - MASS OF THE LORD'S SUPPER

Jesus and the Apostles gather together in the Upper Room for a special meal - The Last Supper. We remember the words Jesus said at that meal; 'Do This in Memory of Me'. We recall that Jesus washed the feet of the 12 Apostles. Perhaps place a jug and bowl of water on a table nearby as you too join the Mass of the Last Supper.

GOOD FRIDAY - 3pm - CELEBRATION OF THE LORD'S PASSION

We enter into the Passion through the account from St John's Gospel and we recall the Way of the Cross. 'Hosanna'...replaced by 'Crucify Him'... and then finally, "It is accomplished'. In our homes we can venerate the Cross and remember again the love Christ showed for us when he stretched out his arms on that Cross.



HOLY SATURDAY - 10am - WAITING WITH THE WOMEN OF THE CROSS

After the grief and sorrow of Good Friday, now there is only silence. We may feel bereft, empty after the events of yesterday. The women who had followed Jesus from Galilee must have felt the same. Join us via webcam at 10am on Holy Saturday morning, as we spend some time with them in music, prayer and reflection.
