JANUARY 22ND: SUNDAY OF THE WORD OF GOD

At the end of 2019, the Year of Mercy, Pope Francis proposed setting aside one Sunday a year given over entirely to the Word of God - marking the reality that without the Scriptures, the events of the mission of Jesus and his Church in the world would be incomprehensible. As St. Jerome reminded us, 'Ignorance of the Scriptures is ignorance of Christ'.

Today is a day to give thanks for the Word of God, which we hear in our readings whenever we attend Mass or other liturgical ceremonies. The Three Year Sunday Cycle [Years A, B, and C] gives us readings from the gospels of Matthew, Mark and Luke - with connected First Readings from the Old Testament - and a continuous reading from the letters of St. Paul. We get St. John's Gospel throughout the year as it fits the feast we are marking and in the Weekday Two Year Cycle [I and II], we get an opportunity to hear about many of the best known events from the Old Testament and the Book of Revelation.

Today is also a day to express our appreciation to our Ministers of the Word, who proclaim our readings and our priests who help us to apply what we hear to the bits and pieces of our daily lives.
